. . *Was it for me?*

Jesus Christ, though He owns all the Universe, lived a borrowed life.

In His human life of 33 years . . .

He was born in a borrowed manger
Borrowed houses throughout His ministry
Borrowed an animal to enter Jerusalem
Borrowed lodgings from friends in Bethany
Borrowed a room for Passover

Borrowed . . .

Borrowed a Roman cross for a few hours

Borrowed a grave at the end, and

. . even His clothes went to those who executed Him!

John 19:23-24

Now the tunic was ***without seam***, woven from the top in one piece.

They said therefore among themselves,
“Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it, whose it shall be,”

that the Scripture might be fulfilled which says:

*“They divided My garments among them,
And for My clothing they cast lots.”*

God’s whole-hearted love should not be returned
with half-hearted love on our part.

. . *Was it for me?*

Philippians 2:5:11

Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men.

God came down . . .

Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. For this reason also, God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee will bow . .

. . of those who are in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and that every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

. . *Was it for me?*

Isaiah 9:6-7

For unto us a Child is born,
unto us a Son is given;

And the government will be upon His
shoulder. And His name
will be called

Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God,
Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Of the increase of His government and
peace there will be no end.

God came down

. . *as a Man.*

Matthew 1:22-23

So all this was done that it might be fulfilled which
was spoken by the Lord through the prophet,
saying:

*“Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and
bear a Son,*

and they shall call His name Immanuel,”

which is translated,

“God with us.”

. . Was it for me?

God, the Son,

. . fed over 5000 people with 5 loaves

of bread and two fish,

*. . walked on the sea and stilled
the storm,*

. . gave sight to the blind,

. . cured many of leprosy,

. . healed multitudes,

. . raised the dead!

. . *Was it for me?*

Matthew 14:13-21

When Jesus heard it, He departed from there by boat to a deserted place by Himself. But when the multitudes heard it, they followed Him on foot from the cities.

And when Jesus went out He saw a great multitude; and He was moved with compassion for them, and healed their sick.

When it was evening, His disciples came to Him, saying,

“This is a deserted place, and the hour is already late. Send the multitudes away, that they may go into the villages and buy themselves food.”

But Jesus said to them,
“They do not need to go away.
You give them something to eat.”

God, the Son,

. . fed over 5000 people.

And they said to Him, “We have here only five loaves and two fish.”

He said, “Bring them here to Me.”

Then He commanded the multitudes to sit down on the grass. And He took the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, He blessed and broke and gave the loaves to the disciples; and the disciples gave to the multitudes.

So they all ate and were filled, and they took up twelve baskets full of the fragments that remained.

Now those who had eaten were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

. . *Was it for me?*

Matthew 14:22-33

Immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go before Him to the other side, while He sent the multitudes away. And when He had sent the multitudes away, He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray. Now when evening came, He was alone there.

But the boat was now in the middle of the sea, tossed by the waves, for the wind was contrary.

Now in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went to them, walking on the sea. And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, "*It is a ghost!*" And they cried out for fear.

But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying,
*"Be of good cheer! It is I;
do not be afraid."*

God, the Son, walked on the sea,

. . *and stilled the storm.*

And Peter answered Him and said, "*Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water.*"

So He said, "*Come.*"

And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus. But when he saw that the wind was boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink he cried out, saying, "*Lord, save me!*"

And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him, "*O you of little faith, why did you doubt?*"

And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased.

Then those who were in the boat came and worshiped Him, saying,

"Truly You are the Son of God."

. . *Was it for me?*

John 9:1-11

Now as Jesus passed by, He saw a man who was blind from birth. And His disciples asked Him, saying, *“Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?”*

Jesus answered, *“Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but that the works of God should be revealed in him. I must work the works of Him who sent Me while it is day; the night is coming when no one can work. As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world.”*

When He had said these things, He spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva; and He anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay. And He said to him, *“Go, wash in the pool of Siloam” (which is translated, Sent).*

So he went and washed, and came back seeing. Therefore the neighbors and those who previously had seen that he was blind said, *“Is not this he who sat and begged?”*

Some said, *“This is he.”* Others said, *“He is like him.”* He said, *“I am he.”*

Therefore they said to him, *“How were your eyes opened?”* He answered and said, *“A Man called Jesus made clay and anointed my eyes and said to me, ‘Go to the pool of Siloam and wash.’ So I went and washed, and I received sight.”*

God, the Son,
. . *gave sight to the blind.*

John 9:18-22,24,25

But the Jews . . asked them, saying, *“Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How then does he now see?”* His parents answered them and said, *“We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind; but by what means he now sees we do not know, or who opened his eyes we do not know. He is of age; ask him. He will speak for himself.”*

So they again called the man who was blind, and said to him, *“Give God the glory! We know that this Man is a sinner.”*

He answered and said, *“Whether He is a sinner or not I do not know. One thing I know: that though I was blind, now I see.”*

. . *Was it for me?*

God, the Son of Man,
raised the dead, and

. . *wept!*

. . *Was it for me?*

John 11:32-44

Then, when Mary came where Jesus was, and saw Him, she fell down at His feet, saying to Him, *“Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died.”*
Therefore, when Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her weeping, He groaned in the spirit and was troubled.

And He said, *“Where have you laid him?”*
They said to Him, *“Lord, come and see.”*

Jesus wept.

God, the Son, . . . *raised Lazarus,* and,
God, the Son of Man, . . . *wept!*

Then the Jews said, *“See how He loved him!”* And some of them said, *“Could not this Man, who opened the eyes of the blind, also have kept this man from dying?”*

Then Jesus, again groaning in Himself, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay against it. Jesus said, *“Take away the stone.”*

Martha, the sister of him who was dead, said to Him, *“Lord, by this time there is a stench, for he has been dead four days.”* Jesus said to her, *“Did I not say to you that if you would believe you would see the glory of God?”* Then they took away the stone from the place where the dead man was lying.

And Jesus lifted up His eyes and said,

“Father, I thank You that You have heard Me. And I know that You always hear Me, but because of the people who are standing by I said this, that they may believe that You sent Me.”

Now when He had said these things, He cried with a loud voice,

“Lazarus, come forth!”

And he who had died came out bound hand and foot with grave-clothes, and his face was wrapped with a cloth. Jesus said to them,

“Loose him, and let him go.”

. . Was it for me?

Luke 19:41-44

Now as He [Jesus]
drew near,

He saw the city and

wept over it

saying,

*“If you had known, even you,
especially in this your day,*

the things that make

for your peace!

God, the Son of Man,
saw Jerusalem, and

. . wept!

But now they are hidden

from your eyes.

. . because

you did not know

the time of your visitation.”

. . *Was it for me?*

Luke 22:39-44

Coming out, He went to the Mount of Olives, as He was accustomed, and His disciples also followed Him. When He came to the place, He said to them,

“Pray that you may not enter into temptation.”

Facing His own death,
God, the Son of Man,

. . . wept!

And He was withdrawn from them about a stone's throw, and He knelt down and prayed, saying

“Father, if it is Your will, take this cup away from Me; nevertheless not My will, but Yours, be done.”

Then an angel appeared to Him from heaven, strengthening Him.

And being in agony, He prayed more earnestly.

Then His sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground.

. . *Was it for me?*

Mark 15:33-34,37-39

Now when the sixth hour had come,
there was darkness over the whole
land until the ninth hour.

And at the ninth hour Jesus cried
out with a loud voice, saying,

“Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?”

which is translated,

*“My God, My God,
why have You forsaken Me?”*

And Jesus cried out with a loud voice,
and breathed His last.

As He was dying on the cross,
.. God, the Son of Man,
.. *wept!*

So when the centurion, who stood
opposite Him, saw that He cried
out like this and breathed
His last, he said,

“Truly this Man was the Son of God!”

. . *Was it for me?*

God, the Father, said of God, the Son,

“ . . I am well pleased.”

Mark 1:9-11

It came to pass in those days that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee, and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And immediately, coming up from the water, He saw the heavens parting and the Spirit descending upon Him like a dove. Then a voice came from heaven,

“You are My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.”

Matthew 17:5

While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them; and suddenly a voice came out of the cloud, saying,

“This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Hear Him!”

God, the Son of Man, taught that,

. . He must die! Why?

Mark 8:31

And He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things, and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again.

. . so that we might live, Christ Died in Our Place!

Romans 5:6-10

For when we were still without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. For scarcely for a righteous man will one die; yet perhaps for a good man someone would even dare to die. But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him. For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life.

. . *Was it for me?*

Why must there be death and

. . shed blood?

Ezekiel 18:20 The soul who sins shall die.

Leviticus 17:11

. . for it is the blood that makes atonement for the soul.

Hebrews 9:22

Indeed, under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and *without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins.*

Hebrews 9:14

. . how much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without spot to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?

The Son of God, the Son of Man, was

. . the Lamb without spot or blemish!

1 Peter 1:17

And if you call on the Father, who without partiality judges according to each one's work, conduct yourselves throughout the time of your stay here in fear; knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers,

but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot.

He indeed was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you who through Him believe in God, who raised Him from the dead and gave Him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God.

. . *Was it for me?*

The Moral Law of God: Exodus 20:3-17

And God spoke all these words, saying:

1. "You shall have no other gods before Me.
2. "You shall not make for yourself a carved image
— any likeness of anything
3. "You shall not take the
name of the Lord your God in vain,
for the Lord will not hold him guiltless
who takes His name in vain.
4. "Remember the Sabbath day
5. "Honor your father and your mother
6. "You shall not murder.
7. "You shall not commit adultery.
8. "You shall not steal.
9. "You shall not bear false witness
against your neighbor.
10. "You shall not covet

James 2:10

For whoever shall keep the whole law,
and yet stumble in one point,
he is guilty of all.

Physical death comes to all.
Because people die, a Savior is necessary for life!

Ezekiel 18:20 The soul who sins shall die.

Matthew 22:13 There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

Isaiah 59:2

But your iniquities have separated you from your God;
And your sins have hidden His face from you, . .
. . so that He will not hear.

I have broken the Moral Law of God and the just penalty for my willful sin is death.

3. Lord's Name in vain. Using "OMG" or "Jesus Christ" as a swear word, violates His law.
7. Adultery. *"Whoever looks at a woman to lust for her has already committed adultery."*
8. Steal. To steal anything makes me a thief.
9. False Witness. To ever lie about anything, makes me a liar.
10. Covet. To ever desire what someone else possesses makes me covetous.

. . *Was it for me?*

Not trusting in Jesus,

. . brings tears + pain forever!

. . *Was it for me?*

Matthew 22:1-13
The Parable of the Wedding Feast

And Jesus answered and spoke to them again by parables and said
*"The kingdom of heaven is like a certain king who arranged a
marriage for his son, and sent out his servants to call those
who were invited to the wedding; and they
were not willing to come.*

*Again, he sent out other servants, saying, 'Tell those who are
invited, "See, I have prepared my dinner; my oxen and
fatted cattle are killed, and all things are ready.
Come to the wedding."'*

Not trusting Christ = no wedding garment,
. . and weeping forever!

*But they made light of it and went their ways, one to his own farm,
another to his business. And the rest seized his servants,
treated them spitefully, and killed them. But when the
king heard about it, he was furious. And he sent out
his armies, destroyed those murderers,
and burned up their city.*

*Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding is ready, but those who
were invited were not worthy. Therefore go into the highways,
and as many as you find, invite to the wedding.' So those
servants went out into the highways and gathered
together all whom they found, both bad and
good. And the wedding hall was
filled with guests.*

*"But when the king came in to see the guests, he saw a man
there who did not have on a wedding garment. So he said
to him, 'Friend, how did you come in here without a
wedding garment?' And he was speechless.
Then the king said to the servants,*

*'Bind him hand and foot, take him away, and
cast him into outer darkness; there will
be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'* "

. . *Was it for me?*

There will be no weeping for those who,
. . trust in Jesus Christ.

John 10:27-30

“My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me. And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand.

My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch them out of My Father’s hand.

I and My Father are one.”

Because of the tears & death of Jesus,
God will wipe away every tear for
. . those who trust Him.

Revelation 21:4

And God will wipe away every tear
from their eyes;

there shall be no more

death
sorrow
crying

There shall be no more

pain

for the former things
have passed away.

. . *Was it for me?*

2 Corinthians 5:17

Therefore, if anyone
is in Christ,
he is a new creation;
old things have passed away;
behold, all things have become new.

God is urging all people to

. . *come now to trust Jesus Christ!*

2 Peter 3:9-10

The Lord is . . not willing that any should perish
but that all should come to repentance.

But the day of the Lord will come
as a thief in the night,

in which the heavens will pass away
with a great noise, and the elements
will melt with fervent heat;

both the earth and the works that
are in it will be burned up.

. . *Was it for me?*

The next chapter after,
. . the last!

. . *Was it for me?*

Epilogue

Jesus Buried in Joseph's Tomb
John 19:38-42

After this, Joseph of Arimathea, being a disciple of Jesus,
but secretly, for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he
might take away the body of Jesus; and Pilate
gave him permission.

So he came and took the body of Jesus.

And Nicodemus, who at first came to Jesus by night,
also came, bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes,
about a hundred pounds.

Then they took the body of Jesus, and bound it in strips
of linen with the spices, as the custom of the Jews is
to bury. Now in the place where He was crucified
there was a garden, and in the garden a new
tomb in which no one had yet been laid.

So there they laid Jesus.

The homeless Man,

. . buried.

Jesus Buried in Joseph's Tomb
Matthew 27:57-61

Now when evening had come, there came a rich man from Arimathea,
named Joseph, who himself had also become a disciple of Jesus.
This man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then
Pilate commanded the body to be given to him.

When Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth,
and laid it in his new tomb which he had hewn out of
the rock; and he rolled a large stone against the
door of the tomb, and departed.

. . *Was it for me?*

He Is Risen

Matthew 28:1-6

Now after the Sabbath, as the first day of the week began to dawn, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb.

And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven, and came and rolled back the stone from the door, and sat on it. His countenance was like lightning, and his clothing as white as snow. And the guards shook for fear of him, and became like dead men.

But the angel answered and said to the women, "*Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified.*"

He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay."

He Is Risen

Mark 16:1-6

Now when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him. Very early in the morning, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. And they said among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?" But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away—for it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed.

But he said to them, "*Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him.*"

Why do you seek the living,

. . among the dead?

He Is Risen

Luke 24:1-6

Now on the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they, and certain other women with them, came to the tomb bringing the spices which they had prepared. But they found the stone rolled away from the tomb. Then they went in and did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. And it happened, as they were greatly perplexed about this, that behold, two men stood by them in shining garments. Then, as they were afraid and bowed their faces to the earth, they said to them,

*"Why do you seek the living among the dead?
He is not here, but is risen!"*

. . *Was it for me?*

Daniel 7:13-14

“I was watching in the night visions, and behold, One like the Son of Man,
Coming with the clouds of heaven! He came to the Ancient of Days,
and they brought Him near before Him.

Then to Him was given dominion and glory and a kingdom, that all peoples,
nations, and languages should serve Him. His dominion is an
everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away,
and His kingdom the one which shall not be destroyed.

Psalm 110:1

The Lord said to my Lord,
“Sit at My right hand, till I make Your enemies Your footstool.”

God, the risen Son, now,
. . rules the universe!

Hebrews 1:1-3, 8-12

God, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the
fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by His Son,
whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made
the worlds; who being the brightness of His glory and the express
image of His person, and upholding all things by the word of
His power, when He had by Himself purged our sins, sat
down at the right hand of the Majesty on high.

But to the Son He says:
“Your throne, O God, is forever and ever;
A scepter of righteousness is the scepter of Your kingdom.

*You have loved righteousness and hated lawlessness;
Therefore God, Your God, has anointed You
with the oil of gladness more than Your companions.”*

*And: “You, Lord, in the beginning laid the foundation of the earth,
And the heavens are the work of Your hands.*

*They will perish, but You remain;
And they will all grow old like a garment;*

*Like a cloak You will fold them up,
And they will be changed.
But You are the same,
And Your years will not fail.”*

. . *Was it for me?*

Then the end,
. . *that never ends!*

All Things Made New
Revelation 21:22-27

Now I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away. Also there was no more sea.

But I saw no temple in it, for the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple. The city had no need of the sun or of the moon to shine in it, for the glory of God illuminated it.

The Lamb is its light.

And the nations of those who are saved shall walk in its light, and the kings of the earth bring their glory and honor into it. Its gates shall not be shut at all by day (there shall be no night there).

And they shall bring the glory and the honor of the nations into it. But there shall by no means enter it anything that defiles, or causes an abomination or a lie, but only those who are written in the Lamb's Book of Life.

. .and Christians have become,
. . *joint-heirs with Christ!*

Romans 8:14-17

For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God. For you did not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, "Abba, Father."

The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children,

then heirs—heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ,

if indeed we suffer with Him, that we may also be glorified together.

. . *Was it for me?*

To have an eternal home in the
Father's house and
eternal joy,

*. . ours sins must be paid for by
the eternal Savior.*

I go to prepare a place for you
John 14:1-3, 6

"Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in Me.

In My Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to Myself, that where I am you may be also."

Jesus said to him, *"I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."*

. . *Was it for me?*

Acts 16:30,31

"Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"

So they said,

"Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ,

and you will be saved"

Have you heard in your
heart, the voice of God,
. . calling you to be saved?

John 10:9

Then Jesus said to them again . .

"I am the door.

If anyone enters by Me,

He will be saved."

. . *Was it for me?*

1. JESUS is GOD.

1 Timothy 3:16

And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness:
God was manifested in the flesh, justified in the Spirit,
seen by angels, preached among the Gentiles,
believed on in the world,
received up in glory.

2. ALL SCRIPTURE, in the original languages, is GOD
inspired and nothing can be discarded.

2 Timothy 3:16

All Scripture is given by inspiration of
God, for reproof, for correction, and
is profitable for doctrine,
for instruction in
righteousness.

1. Jesus is God
2. All Scripture is Inspired

[Saved by Grace, it is the gift of God, not of our works]

I have rebelled against Your will and have chosen to take my own way to my hurt and to the hurt of those around me.

I solemnly choose to let go of everything in my life and give all completely to You, the rightful Sovereign Owner.

My Prayer, expressing my desire to say “Yes”

. . .to Jesus calling me to Him!

*Would You please draw me now to Yourself,
forgive me and give me Your life?*

Then one said to Jesus,

And He said to them,

the narrow gate,
for many,
I say to you,
will seek to enter

. . and what He did for you?

Acts 4:12

“Nor is there salvation in any other,

*for there is no other name [Jesus Christ]
under heaven given
among men
by which*

we must be saved.”
