The Qur'an explicitly states that women are comparable to crops, to be utilized at one's discretion. This direct objectification of women plays a significant role in categorizing them as commodities and instruments of sexual desire within society. Islam not only grants men the authority to engage in polygamy but actively promotes it.



In order to rationalize this practice within the Islamic faith, numerous Islamic preachers assert that men previously possessed the privilege of entering into multiple marriages, whereas Islam has actually restricted this practice to a maximum of four marriages for men.
