5. What comfort do you find in Jesus admitting, "My soul is troubled"?
6. How does Jesus's prediction of being "lifted up" (crucified) show His control over its universal effect?
7. If Christ's words are the Father's perfect will, how does this elevate Scripture's authority in your life?
8. What does Jesus's urgent command to "walk while you have the light" reveal about His concern for unbelievers?
9. Why did Jesus delegate the role of ultimate judgment to His own spoken Word?
10. How did the Greeks' request to "see Jesus" signal the non-exclusive nature of His mission?
