Salvation Story: Abdullah Amin

That video broke through the defenses I had built around my heart. It spoke directly to that quiet, nagging question I had carried for years. The message

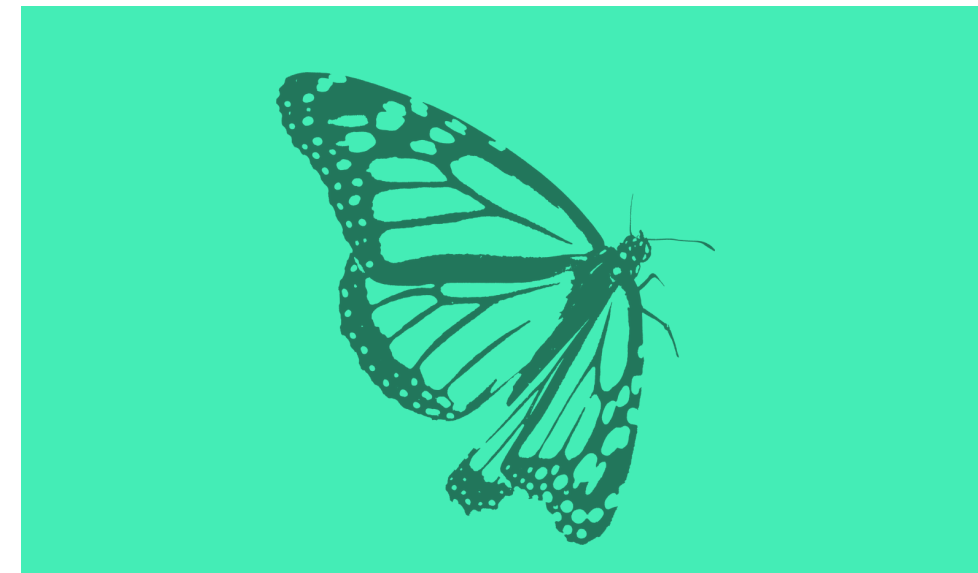
